Contents: Judgments on rights of property; crimes against humanity.

Characters: GOD, Moses.

Conclusion: Mankind's attitude toward his fellow man in reflects his attitude to

GOD and **GOD's** law.

Key Word: Judgments, Exodus 21:1.

Strong Verses: 29, 30, 31.

Striking Facts: One is struck by the number of things we are told NOT to do. These negative commands reveal depraved condition of human nature. We are <u>restored</u> "spiritually" from this condition through **CHRIST**'s sacrifice, IF WE ACCEPT **HIM**!!

Definitions:

Depraved - morally corrupt; wicked.

Depraved indifference - a standard used to show "mens rea", or the state of mind of a defendant.

Mens Rea - As an element of criminal responsibility, a guilty mind; a guilty or wrongful purpose; a criminal intent.
