Matthew Chapter 1 "The Birth of the Messiah"

Contents: Generations of JESUS CHRIST. HIS conception and birth.

Characters: GOD, **CHRIST**, **HOLY SPIRIT**, Joseph, Mary, generations of **CHRIST** from Abraham to David.

Conclusion: JESUS CHRIST was, in accordance with the prophecies, conceived of the **HOLY GHOST** and born of a virgin. **HE** was both **SON** of Man and **SON** of **GOD**, thereby being qualified to save **HIS** people from their sins.

Key Word: Genealogy, 1, 17.

Strong Verses: 21, 22, 23.

Striking Facts: 10. See Genesis 3:15; Isaiah 7:14; 8:8, 10; Micah 5:2-3. **JESUS** was not begotten of natural generation. "Mary, of whom was born **JESUS**." A feminine form for the word "born" being used, indicates that **JESUS** was born of Mary, not of man. **HE** was without a sinful nature, for the reason that **HE** had the **HOLY SPIRIT** for **HIS FATHER**.

Word Study

Homoousios – Greek – same essence.

Homo - Greek "the same".

Ousia – Greek - is an important philosophical and theological term, originally used in ancient Greek philosophy, then later in Christian theology. It was used by various ancient Greek philosophers, like Plato and Aristotle, as a primary designation for philosophical concepts of *essence* or *substance*.
